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FAUQUIER COUNTY COURT, DECEMBER TERM 1891.

The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Fauquier, and now attending the said court, upon their oath present that Lee Heflin on or about the 9th day of November 1891 in the night time of said day, in the county aforesaid, in and upon one Annie Kines in the peace of the Commonwealth and the people of this state then and there being, feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did make an assault; and that the said Lee Heflin with a certain stick of wood or some deadly weapon which he, the said Lee Heflin, in his hand then and there held, upon the head of the said Annie Kines then and there feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did inflict divers blows and the said Lee Heflin with the bludgeon aforesaid in and upon the head of her, the said Annie Kines, then and there feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did strike inflicting one mortal wound in and upon the head of the said Annie Kines of which said mortal wound the said Annie Kines instantly died.

And the jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do say that the said Lee Heflin in manner and form aforesaid, feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought her, the said Annie Kines, did kill and murder against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Fauquier, and now attending the said court, upon their oath present that Lee Heflin on or about the 9th day of November 1891 in the night time of said day, in the county aforesaid, in and upon one Annie Kines in the peace of the Commonwealth and the people of this state then and there being, feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did make an assault; and that the said Lee Heflin with a certain stick of wood or some deadly weapon which he, the said Lee Heflin, in his hand then and there held, upon the head of the said Annie Kines then and there feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did inflict divers blows and the said Lee Heflin with the bludgeon aforesaid in and upon the head of her, the said Annie Kines, then and there feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did strike inflicting one mortal wound in and upon the head of the said Annie Kines of which said mortal wound the said Annie Kines instantly died.

And the jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do say that the said Lee Heflin in manner and form aforesaid, feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought her, the said Annie Kines, did kill and murder against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

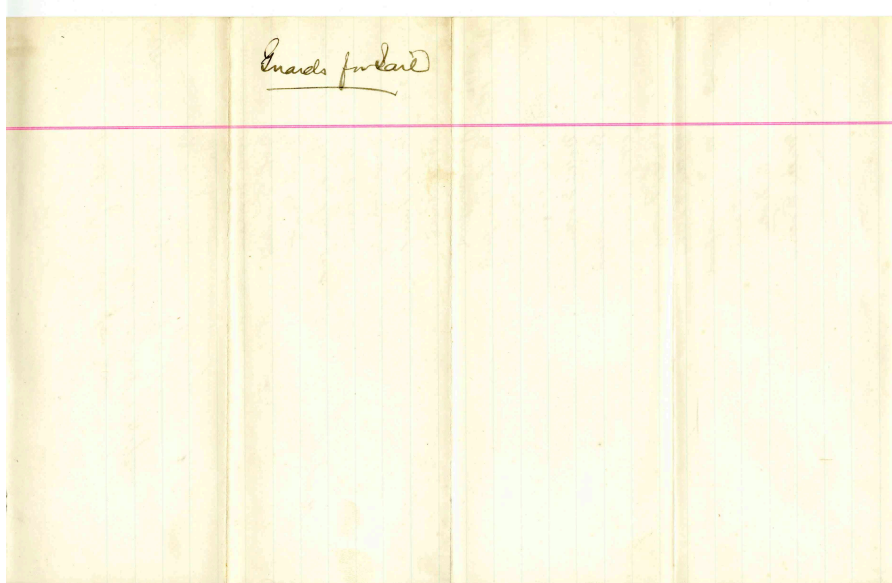

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Guards for Jail

CODE 1887.

Allowance to Jailor, and for Clothing.

Sec. 1892.—The allowance to the jailor for the maintenance and care of a inmate shall be fixed by the court in whose jail he is confined, not exceeding fifty cents for each day such inmate is kept and supported therein. No more shall be allowed for his clothing than thirty dollars a year. No such allowance shall be audited and paid unless it appears to the satisfaction of it that the jailor proved to the court that, immediately after the commitment of the inmate, and at least once in every ten months thereafter, application was made to the board of directors of each of the asylums for admission, and that such application was refused for want of room, or that such application was not continued because the admission of the inmate had been refused for some other cause than the want of room.

To a Jailor.

Sec. 1893.—For receiving a person in jail when first committed, 25c.
For keeping and supporting him therein for each day, 50c.
But when there are as many as three and more than ten prisoners in jail, for each, 30c.
When there are ten or more prisoners in jail, for each, 25c.

Allowance to Jailor, and for Clothing.

SEC. 1695.—The allowance to the jailor for the maintenance and care of a lunatic shall be fixed by the court in whose jail he is confined, not exceeding fifty cents for each day such lunatic is kept and supported therein. No more shall be allowed for his clothing than thirty dollars a year. No such allowance shall be audited and paid unless it appears in the certificate of it that the jailor proved to the court that, immediately after the commitment of the lunatic, and at least once in every two months thereafter, application was made to the boards of directors of each of the asylums for admission, and that such application was refused for want of room, or that such application was not continued because the admission of the lunatic had been refused for some other cause than the want of room.

SEC. 3532.—For receiving a person in jail when first committed, 25C.

For keeping and supporting him therein for each day, 40C.

But when there are as many as three and less than ten prisoners in jail, for each, 30C.

When there are ten or more prisoners in jail, for each, 25C.
